Mass. Institute of Technology.

At the request of the Woman's Education Association of Boston, and with their generous coöperation, new laboratories for the instruction of women will be ready for occupancy October 23d, and students will be received on or after that date.

The design is to afford facilities for the advanced study of Chemical Analysis, Mineralogy, and Chemistry as related to Vegetable and Animal Physiology and to the Industrial Arts. Each subject may be pursued by itself, or in connection with studies in other departments of the Institute. The courses are intended for such as may be able to devote their whole time to the work, as well as those who, by reason of other engagements, can spend only a few hours a week in the laboratories.

It is highly desirable that all who avail themselves of the privileges here offered should have had some previous practice in chemical manipulation.

An excellent set of microscopes and other apparatus for the physiological laboratory, has been provided by generous donations and by purchases made in Europe during the past summer.

The laboratories will be open from 8-30 A. M. till 5-30 P. M.

Students on entering will be expected to give the Treasurer the same guaranty for the payment of all dues, as is given by students in other departments, and will pay the same fees.
