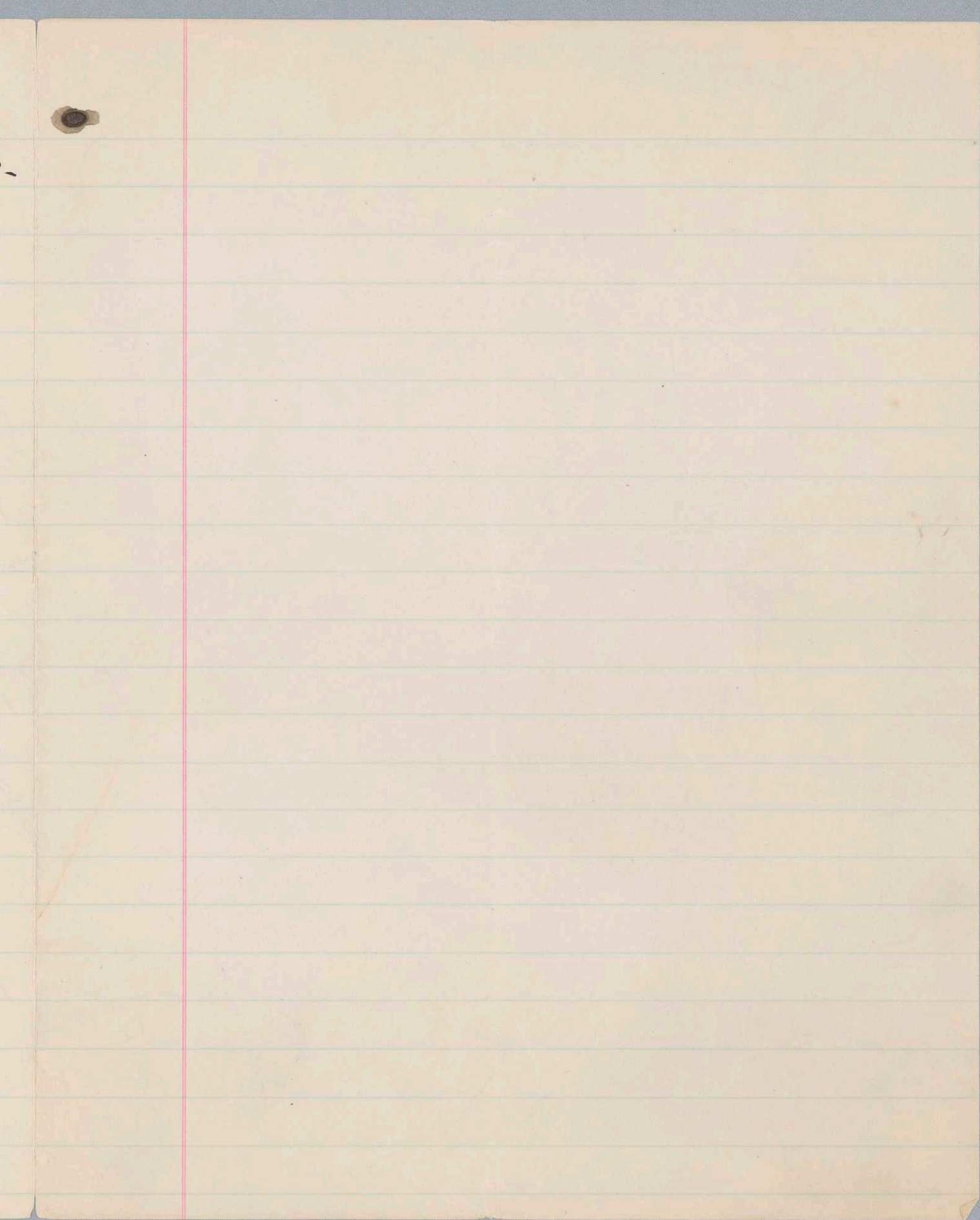
The Inst. furnished 100 dollars worth of apparatus to start the Industrial Laboratory and since then the rooms have been so connected that it is impossible to separate accounts.

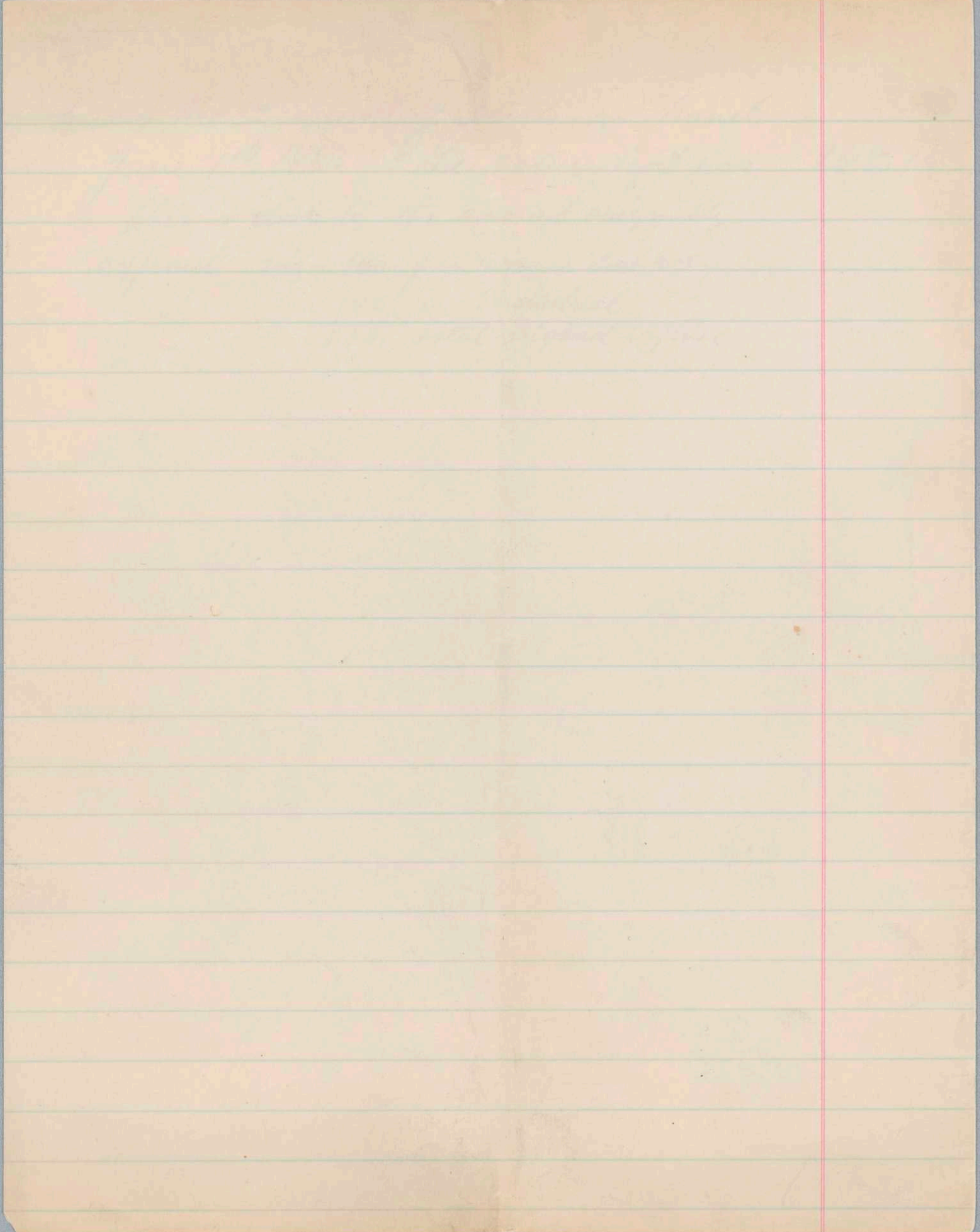

1876-77 23 Students - Received for tuition about 800.

1877-78 30 Students " " " " 800.

2 students received laboratory instruction for assisting in the work.

1 for work on papyrographing.

1878-79 23 Students Received for tuition 766.

The tuition money up to the end of 1879 was received by Prof. Ordway and ~~used~~ ^{was} chiefly used in fitting up the biological laboratory. 200 dollars of it was given to Mrs Richards for special work in mineralogy.

From Sept 1879² the tuition was paid to the Trust and the running expenses were paid by Mrs Richards from the income derived from commercial work, largely work in oils.

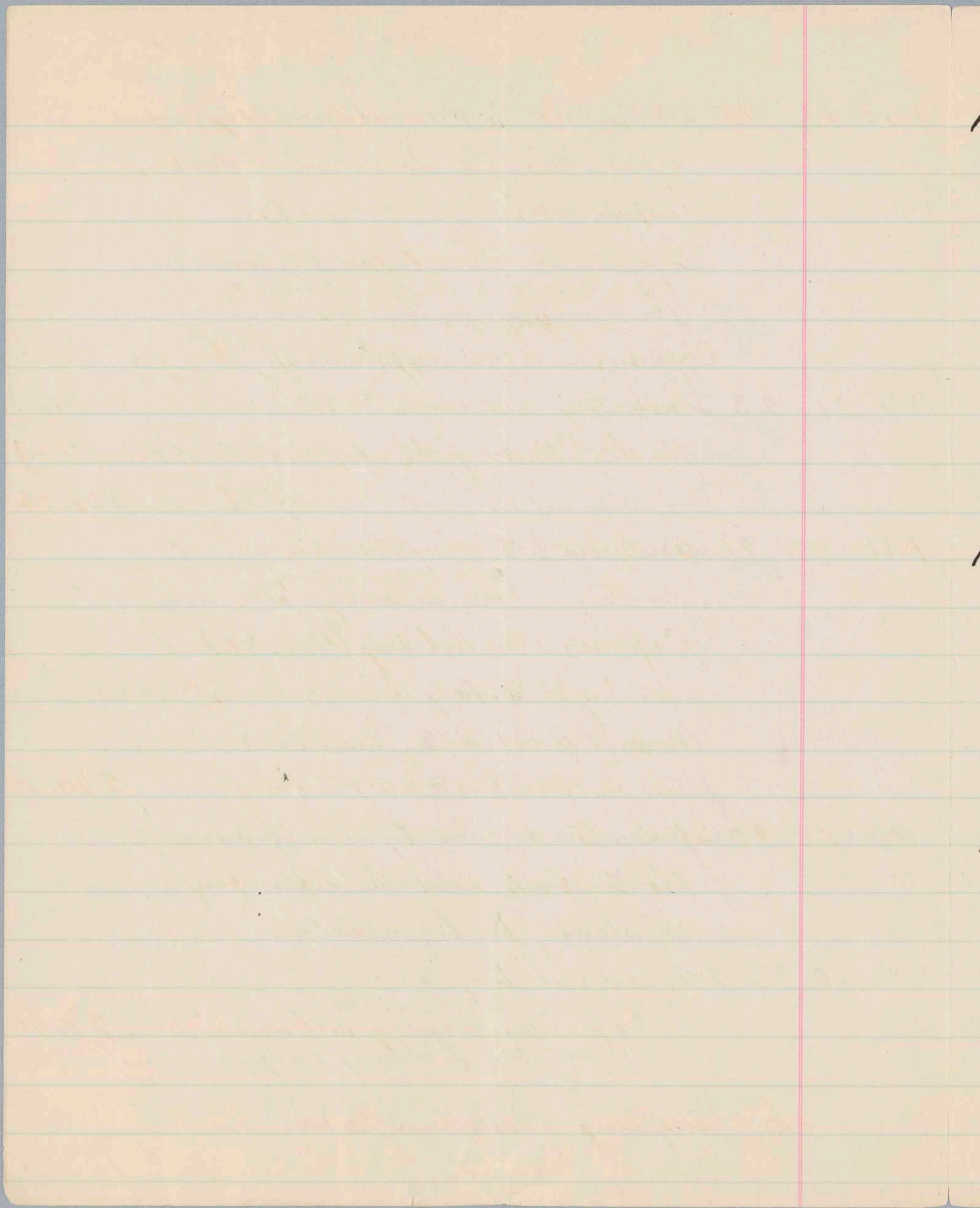
