My dear Sir:-

At the request of Mr. Lawrence Addicks, we are giving you herewith all the available information in regard to bagging in use at our bag house.

Our last purchase of this material was made in June 1923, from the Duro Company, 48-50 Pearl St., Boston, Mass.

We purchased from them 9" White Wool Tubing for which we paid \$2.20 per yard, for 60" wide fabric, plus 5¢ a yard for each yard of tubing, to cover the sewing. Each yard of cloth making two yards of tubing.

Our specifications for the wool cloth were that it should contain 8% natural grease, thirty-six threads per inch, and be chemically treated to withstand the action of scid and corresive salts.

The f.o.b. point for this material was Boston, Mass.

We are unable to give you any up to date prices, since we have sent out no inquiries on this particular material since the last purchase in June 1923.
