Orenberg's drawn map is so random & sparse in the Back Bay Area there is little point in annotating it. His "downtown" area, however is full and accurate – it runs bet. Boylston-Essex and State–Court. Tremont, Washington & Chauncey give it its depth. He knows many of the intersecting sts. & their ties – Avery, West, Temple Place, Winter – Summer, Milk, Franklin & Water. Federal & Congress run from Milk to State. This is the extent of his map except for a few slightly indicated Back Bay Sts.

Orenberg's interview map on the other hand shows a pretty good knowledge of Back Bay, a complete arc of Beacon Hill & of the area between Park St, Summer – Winter & Cornhill. The actual downtown financial does not come thro so clearly – Though many sts. are given a label. In his case in particular I think the interview map is a necessity if cue is to realize that he has even clambered out of the business & shopping end of town.
