MITRE ACCOUNTABILITY

(J.A. Arnow) (SECRET)

A meeting with representatives of Westinghouse and Boeing in Baltimore was attended on 17 November. The integration of the present F-99 ground system (G-20) and the Transition System was discussed. No conclusions were reached but subjects to be discussed at future meetings were tentatively outlined. Responsibility for organization of any future meetings will rest with Boeing.

(A.P. Kromer) (SECRET)

At a conference with representatives from Air Force and Project ADES (formerly ADA) advice was received from USAF Headquarters in Washington that the necessary approvals have been obtained and action is being taken to make 48.9 million dollars of FY 1954 funds and 91 million dollars of FY 1955 funds available for procurement of equipment in addition to the two prototype models.

(H.D. Neumann) (SECRET)

The program which simulates target interception by F-99 has been completed, and two parameter tapes have been written. Three parts were tested and modified. Three additional test programs will be written to test the rest.

(B. Smulowicz, W.I. Wells) (SECRET)

The investigation of a new dive doctrine intended to improve the effectiveness of the Bomarc missile against low-flying targets has been completed. The official outline of the investigation and a report of the results will be published shortly in Memorandum M-2443, "Preliminary Studies of the F-99 Interceptor Performance."
