ACTION

1. Union Negotiations

Papian is on the union negotiation committee, and outlined the nature of union demands and the status of negotiations.

2. Radar Presentation

Farr read memorandum from Freedman announcing General Electric presentation on future radar design scheduled for 1:30 P.M. 27 May in A-166; he requested to be advised of names of Division VI personnel who wish to attend the meeting.

3. SENEWS

Farr announced that Volume I, Number 1 of SENEWS, the newsletter of the JCC Science Education Subcommittee was released 16 May for publication in the July issue of PGEC TRANSACTIONS, ACM COMMUNICATIONS, and ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING. Preprints will be distributed to interested staff members at Lincoln. Farr requested criticism and assistance in preparing the next newsletter for September publication.

4. ID Problem

Israel proposed procurement (purchase or rental) of a Remington-Rand teletype-writer machine for use on the CHARM project. Discussion centered on the possibility of reducing MI Room delay time by use of the Remington-Rand or other equipment.

5. System Tests Specs

Everett discussed question raised by Currie of BTL concerning Lincoln approval of system test specifications -- Rader has been handling -- although the test spec document is several years old now and ESS experience in the meantime might suggest improvements, BTL needs action from Lincoln to avoid delays at McGuire.

Everett plans to discuss with Currie in New York 20 May.
