ACTION

1. Building F

O'Brien discussed the interest of the 6520th AC&W Squadron in the maintenance coordination team in ESS and some problems which have arisen.

2. Overtime

Proctor pointed out that Division VI overtime in the past quarter year has exceeded the estimate submitted by the Group Leaders.

Proctor requested the Group Leaders to estimate overtime accurately, to monitor their performance against their estimate and to advise him in case of major change.

3. Russian Language Course

Farr read a recent letter from M. M. Kessler announcing the starting of a Scientific Russian Language Course early in January.

4. McGuire Program Status

Morriss discussed the automatic crosstell features of the McGuire program.

5. ATC Tapes

Morriss discussed the status of ATC tapes. Twelve tapes were prepared at Kingston before the machine was removed from service. The tapes are scheduled to be ready by 20 January. The quality of the tapes is in question due probably to an error in the program that made the tapes.

Everett authorized the use of XD-1 as necessary to meet the January 20 dead line. Thompson and Rising will work together in ironing out the difficulty.
