The East Aisle windows (and the East transept) are second best in illumination, window over the entrance being the best light of all.

The West aisle windows are partially obscured by the tan brick walls of the parish house.

The two Southern ones are the best. These windows are about 7 1/2 feet from the floor.

Each aisle window now has two vents, one at the base, and one at top with spring line. They are about 24" x 32"

Building on the West side of church about 20' from the windows, which modifies the light somewhat, but light fairly good.
