Feb. 25. 1930 - C.J.C.'s report upon his return from Baltimore.
"When we came to consider the installation, I said that they could probably have it by spring 1931. They are all greatly interested in the youthful figure of Christ and in the upturned face of the apostles. They realize the window must be dark in order to hold back the direct sun in the early morning services. They would like to see the face of Christ "not so sad".

When ready to send, communicate with Thomas Hicks and Sons, regarding the removal of the temporary boxing. Also about arranging for scaffolding.

Be sure that window is covered until dedication.
