General Information There is a mild Tiffany window in the chancel. The interior is quite small. Lighted by aisle windows in a simple leaded pattern of Green Cathedral, - not bad.

This window should have a good deal of white glass, and should be cool in color. Mr. Connick's suggestion is for a series of incidents in the Life of Christ similar to the one he suggested in the Haverhill design. Four Archangels above, and the tracery and rose shapes ornament and possibly seraphim and cherubim, or possibly symbols of the eight Beatitudes.
