General Information Two little side windows - grisaille.

The chapel will be used for weddings and funerals and small services. It is naturally dark, and of course we shall have to make allowances for this.

Grisaille - to be a sparkling arrangement in light, and will be enriched with borders and simple medallions in pure color. The windows will admit the maximum amount of light without being thin.

~~the present ventilators in the chapel windows are one half the size of the window proper, that is, the entire width of each panel and about 20 inches high.~~
