



General Information Medallion Window (Tenderness and Sympathy) (a) The Blessing of Little Children (b) The Visit to Mary and Martha. (c) The Sermon on the Mount".
Oct. 30, 1929. Dr. Osgood wrote - "In the medallion shown in the sketch of Christ and the little Children, the figure in the lower right hand arc seems to some of us not entirely graceful. It seems a rather unpleasant line. I wonder if, in your making up of the medallion, this figure could not be relocated or in some way put into a more graceful attitude? As I hold the medallion off from me, that particular figure in its lighter coloring, sends out not pleasantly."
