The window is to be "comparable to Simeon and Mary already
"Hosea and Amos." in place, and would go exactly opposite the Simeon
and Mary the Mother window, thus preserving the balance between the east and
west sides of the church - i.e. the balance in terms of over-all design
and detail.

As planned, it is devoted to Ruth of the Old Testament, and Dorcas of the New.

Ruth carries her gleanings with the accompanying text, "Thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God" (Ruth 1:16).

In the medallion below she is represented gathering the gleanings from the field.

Dorcas, or Tabitha, holds a vase of water and flowers, with the text, "This woman was full of good works and almsdeeds" (The Acts 9:36).

Below, she clothes the poor.

In the principal tracery members are Angels of praise and prayer bearing trumpet and censer.

The fields and borders are designed in harmony with the other windows.
