General Information These big windows are to have a motif of white roses for ornament. Windows are east (right) and west (left). The right is to be devoted to Saint Agnes; left, to Saint Catherine. Design is to be developed in medallions and single figures. Two figures of each saint in characteristic types. Rich color schemes with spots of white. All the windows, but especially the big windows, are to be in full color with spots of white.

For the Saint Catherine Window - "The Gift of Ral Parr. In Memory of Kate Key Jenkins".
