General Information Eight double openings with quatrefoil, figures on
grisaille, of the nature suggested in photographs of Westbury, I. I.;
Brockton, Mass. University Church, Chicago.

First window to be "Luke and John" - Evangelists. (North Transept.)

Mr. Study wrote - Sept. 28 - "As a final suggestion - break up the glass
in the figures and Gothic canopy in as many small pieces as you can well
afford. Leaded lines add a great deal you know. The wheel window in St.
Luke's Church, while entirely satisfactory, would naturally be enhanced
if the glass was in smaller pieces."

Keep the lower diamonds, from being detached from the upper portion of
window.
