General Information "Mary of Bethany." (Memorial to Mr. Kelley's Mother.)  
Extract from Mr. Kelley's letter, July 9, 1926.  
"Referring to your letter written some days ago regarding my mother,  
Her name was Susan E. Taylor Kelley; born Oct. 23, 1823, died Nov. 29, 1912,  
aged 89 years, 1 month and 6 days.  
Her father and mother were Baptists as also was my mother. She was a  
good Christian woman, a good wife and a good mother. She was exceed-  
ingly proud and ambitious and, may I add, a woman very highly respected."
