We would all prefer David at the brook selecting his stones with Goliath in the background or something of that sort. The background of the David and Jonathan panel seems too solid blue. Can you suggest something more translucent, more varied color, greens or browns for the earth and different shades of blue for the sky to take away what seems to us a thick look."
