General Information Subject: "Saint Stephen".

Size of room is 14' x 16'

On Noy. 17, 1942, we suggested a new subject - medallions significant to the life of the Blessed Virgin in relation to her Son. This would begin with the Annunciation, which is symbolized in the base of the altar window, and might continue in the side window with such subjects as the Nativity, the Epiphany, the Flight into Egypt, the First Passover; possibly ending with her death and Assumption. Or some of the earlier subject might be included, - such as the Espousal and the Visitation.

Also said Mr. Connick feels Parables offer most excellent subjects for the aisle windows.
