"All of the windows of the Owners' room are devoted to King Arthur and his illustrious Knights and Ladies. I have used the text of Malory's "Le Morte D'Arthur", published by the Medici Society. The North group symbolizes the story of Sir Tristram and La Beale Isoud, while King Arthur's most noble Knights are to be found in the medallions of the Bay. Here also are Merlin, the Lady of the Lake, and others, together with their arms. These are all indicated on the sketches.

I have used significant related incidents in the West windows. These are in simple pencil suggestions."
