General Information ~~Side Windows in the Clerestory - Grisaille, with symbols of the four Evangelists and of the Seven Gifts of the Spirit in the clerestory windows.~~ **Annunciation**

**Six windows nearest chancel in east and west walls. The first two, the Coronation (West) and Annunciation (east) to be completed and set by Christmas. The other four, The Assumption (west) the Nativity (east), Matrimony (west) and Baptism (east) to be completed and set by the above date - June 8, 1930.**

\* The stock beads against which this glass is placed are five eighths of an inch.

For addresses of those to be notified as window progresses, see other side.

With the exception of the Confirmation window which Msgr. Baden will write about later (and which our own Catholic brothers might look up) all these subjects, the Sacraments, will be treated from the Life of Christ as follows. We are to make pencil sketches soon and send them to Monsignor Baden.

1. Baptism (as made).
2. Confirmation.
3. Holy Eucharist: Christ with Chalice and small figures of Saint John and Saint Peter.
4. Penance - Christ forgiving Mary Magdalene.
5. Extreme Unction - Christ healing the Impotent Man.
6. Holy Orders - Christ with extended hands over Peter and John.
7. Matrimony - The Marriage in Cana.

As the heads of the windows have three variations, Schulte suggests that we have three variations and I said we would: 1 - use the present design; 2 - Reverse the reds and blues in same design; 3 - Change the design slightly.

All the windows are to be dark, but East darker than west which is shaded by wall (to be in white glazed brick).

Use a lot of the rough blues in the nave windows.
