I assume that they can be mounted directly in the stone without a metal frame. We have no metal frames on any of the windows except those which are intended to open." ~~XXXXXX~~ Extract from Mr. Backus' letter to Mr. Cram. May 28, 1932.

C.J.C.'s report after Mr. Backus of Detroit came on July 1, 1932: "Cool spots of blues and greens and maybe a few reds. Interesting leaded work like Mr. Cram's Chapel, - the windows above the altar, ivory golds. Put a few spots of Sandwich Glass in these windows."
