General Information 2. Monuments. "I had thought of having the gray unpolished granite and something quite simple. Mother and I have lots in the cemetery side-by-side; she wants one for the Stimson lot and I want one for the Bullitt lot. So I think the two should be considered together."

Oct. 21, 1932 - Description sent with rough sketches: "I have used for themes two beautiful symbols in Christian Art, the Fountain and the Tree. They are often called the Fountain of Life and the Tree of Life. Two verses suggested will make that symbolism clear or the designs could be used without any lettering."

Letter from Mrs. Stimson, Jan. 15, 1933: "May I include in this note a mention of the stones for the Cemetery? We seem to be very difficult to please."

The last photographs illustrating the Fountain of Life and the Tree of Life contain rather too much detail. Our idea was something very simple

but of interesting form and proportion. The stone to contain only the name (Stimson) and the details on personal headstones. I am afraid our own thoughts in the matter have been rather vague, but by a process of elimination have gradually become more definite.".

C.J.C. replied, Jan. 25: "I am sorry that I did not meet your ideas about the stones for the cemetery. I shall try again, and will send you other sketches much simpler.".
