General Information ~~There are several rectangular openings on each side - thirty inches wide by forty-three inches high with cross mullions. The vertical one is one inch wide and the horizontal, three inches. The lower openings are twenty-seven and one-half inches high. The little frame vine-covered chapel is surrounded by trees, but I should say the windows get a fair light if not direct sky-light. (Perhaps Mr. Connick will go with Mrs. Hawley some week end to see the interior of the chapel. - he only saw the exterior on October 4, 1935).~~
