The above price of \$210 includes the removing of the present glass, replacing it with the new sheet of glass 1/2" thick and the necessary scaffolding. This glass was ordered specially from the factory on account of its large size, and it will take about two weeks' time to get it. We corresponded with Mr. Damon of the Pittsburgh Plate Glass Company, and their price was \$154.00 - for 1/2" rough glass.

\*The window is approximately 17' from the ground.

The window is to be washed on the outside as far as possible, and on the inside, just before the new section of plate glass is installed. One of
