 General Information "The Resurrection" and "The Ascension".
 Description of designs: This second pair of designs symbolize Our Lord's Resurrection and Ascension. In the former the stricken soldiers kneel by the open sepulchre, above which rises the figure of Christ, holding the sacred standard and encircled by divine radiance. The Ascension panel presents the figure of the ascending Christ, in the center, and figures of the eleven faithful disciples kneeling below.
 In these panels the light field, delicately controlled by painted texture, is designed to harmonize with the field of the window already in place over the altar. An interesting counter-change in the colors of the borders is also indicated.
