General Information Six aisle windows, three on each side - northeast and southwest.
Large interior. Nave about 70' wide. The windows are now filled with very
poor glass and Prybot is redecorating and has convinced the priest that they
should have new windows.
To represent Polish Saints - although Saint Francis and Saint Anthony are
to form one group, and Saint Teresa and Saint Hedwig another. In a typical
sketch we might use Saint Felix and Saint Stanislaus. The figures on a
simple grisaille with a medallion on the tracery member. He has in mind
windows of about the tone and quality of the chancel in Peterborough with
plenty of good blue. He is taking some color transparencies to show the
priest and he is going to suggest a cost of about one thousand dollars to
twelve hundred dollars per window to see if they can stand that. See later

September 11. Mr. Prybot reported that he had shown the color plates to Father Burant, who was very much pleased with them. He especially liked the first Plainfield window. Also, they visited various New York Churches, including Saint Vincent Ferrer's, and Saint Peter's. He thought the windows were very fine, but altogether too expensive for him. He said he did not think they could spend more than \$450.00, a window, which is a little under ten dollars a square foot. However, Mr. Prybot suggests that we make a sketch for a very simple window that can be done for that price, and a suggestion that could be done for about \$700 a window, in the hope that he may like it well enough to make an additional effort.

Sept. 20, 1935, when sending the sketches wrote, "Saint Felix of Nola is represented with his symbols, the bunch of grapes wherewith he fed Saint Maximus, and the broken shackles from which he was miraculously freed from prison. Saint Stanislaus bears the Christ Child, who appeared to him in a vision."
