General Information There are no trees or other obstructions.  
The windows are all of one size (8)\*, and the colors differ, except opposite ones - that is, two are alike, those opposite each other.  
The first window, for Mr. Connick's Mother, is to have a medallion of the Nativity to represent the First Beatitude - "Blessed are the Poor in Spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven.". The inscription is to be at the base; the Beatitude just below the meeting line of the sash, and the medallion is to be in full color, as beautiful and complete in its way as the New York rose itself.  
\*Only five of the windows are in the main body of the church.
