General Information Ciborium for holding consecrated wafers and to be used
when administering the sacrament of the Eucharist. Its place is in the
tabernacle. The ciborium is to be distinctive, hand made of sterling
silver, Gothic in style. It will be used at the main altar in the large
chapel of this House of Studies. The altar has a high pedee in
which there are fifteen carved panels (in wood) illustrating the fifteen
mysteries of the Rosary.

They have diamonds, valued at \$1200.00 which are to be placed in it.
There is a large brooch, which they would like to have in the cup of the
ciborium. The other diamonds would be placed lower down, some perhaps in
the base and others between the base and the cup; but none of them in the
knop.

making the ciborium or in paying for it. As I have said, the ciborium is to be of solid sterling silver and handwrought. And it is to be plated throughout with gold. We have at our disposal for it \$300 in cash. (Jan.18 - Wrote Fr.McMahon about designer's fee of 20%. -Jan.28.Fr.McMahon can pay \$25.00)

Perhaps we will make the design and Mr. Wooley may carry it out.

Jan.7.Father McMahon wrote: "...It is better to have the cover fit outside. Both the cover and the cup will have a little lip. The cup should be not less than five inches from rim to rim."

The cup is to contain 400 wafers. Wooley's price is \$300.
