General Information "The nave windows call for stained glass only in an inset medallion, which of course could be any other shape you wish rather than the circular one shown. I would like to suggest that if you think it practical, you might furnish the inserts only for these windows, to be leaded into a standard diamond paned glass locally and installed by John Riordan. . . . but only of course with full instructions from you and a sample furnished by you of the type of glass to be used in the diamond paned windows." (Stanley Matthews).

*\$5.00 per foot, or \$70 for each pair., or \$210 for three pairs. - Riordan to do backgrounds. The field will probably need a light painted texture to control the illumination in the southern exposure and to harmonize with the chancel windows. We will establish the pattern and scale, and perhaps make a small sample.

The medallions of the aisle windows devoted to the Early Life of Christ
are symbols of The Nativity of Jesus, ^{The Adoration of the Shepherds,} the Adoration of the Magi, the Flight
into Egypt, the Presentation of the Christ Child, and the Finding of the Child
Jesus in the Temple.
