General Information C.J.C. wrote the Bishop. "I talked with Mr. Maginnis and Mr. McNally while we were in the church about the importance of keeping the windows light."

These windows are devoted to the two great Archangels, St. Gabriel (South) and St. Michael (north). The apparel of St. Gabriel's dalmatic is inscribed with symbols of the Descending Dove and monogram of Our Lady in reference to the Annunciation. He holds the flowering staff, and above is his lily symbol. Text: "Archangel Gabriel, intercessor for us in Heaven" (Daily Missal, Feast of St. Gabriel). St. Michael's golden surcoat over armor is inscribed with his distinctive cross pommee. He bears the flaming sword, and the symbol above again suggests the sword and the scales of justice. Inscription: "Archangel Michael, defend us in battle" (Daily Missal, Feast of St. Michael.).
