Note about inscription:
"The vestry...suggest...that the red bits of glass coming in between the words of the inscription be arranged so that John Franklin Carter stands together and Rector 1900-1930 stands together. We looked at the inscriptions on the other three Chancel windows and discovered that the names were not so separated by bits of colored glass."
