When we sent sketches we wrote: "I carried through an idea related to the symbolism of the aisle window that I hope you will notice; that is, I have carried through the tracery, and into the upper part of the center lancet, the Seven Doves fot the Seven Gifts of the Spirit, as cited by Isaiah in the eleventh chapter ("The Spirit of the Lord shall est upon him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord"), with the first dove, symbol of the Spirit of the Lord, suggested upon the breast of the symbolic figure of Christ.
