General Information "The Calling of James and John".

"Calling of James and John from mending their nets to become part of the  
group of Christ's followers and fishers of men," - emphasizing the figure  
of John in relation to the dedication of the church. Both Our Lord and John  
could very well be represented in fine, pure scarlet."

Description: This window follows the general plan established in the side  
chancel windows, again emphasizing their height thru the heavy vertical  
leads and color arrangement of the foliated fields of growing vine forms.  
The Calling of James and John is symbolized with the emphasis on the figure  
of John clothed in pure white with cloak of ruby, balancing the garment of  
Our Lord. Above is the smaller figure of James beside the ship of their

father Zebedee, with the nets which they were mending. On the open book below is the text from the Fourth Chapter of Matthew, 19th verse, - "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men". The memorial inscription at the base reads, "To the Glory of God and in Loving Memory of Bliss Harold Colpitts, David Harold Colpitts" - with a space for a third name. The outer red border is again enriched with the five-pointed stars of Bethlehem.

Note\*: Mr. Furrer wants us to use our usual method of continuing the ventilator sight-line upward with a narrow border of color, or to use a wide enough border so that a narrow portion of it will show in the ventilator. (See letter of Nov. 2, 1943).
