father Zebedee, with the nets which they were mending. On the open book below is the text from the Fourth Chapter of Matthew, 19th verse, - "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men". The memorial inscription at the base reads, "To the Glory of God and in Loving Memory of Bliss Harold Colpitts, David Harold Colpitts" - with a space for a third name. The outer red border is again enriched with the five-pointed stars of Bethlehem.

Note\*: Mr. Furrer wants us to use our usual method of continuing the ventilator sight-line upward with a narrow border of color, or to use a wide enough border so that a narrow portion of it will show in the ventilator. (See letter of Nov.2,1943).
