General Information Same general plan of design as we used in the chancel windows. Of course the difference in sizes will necessitate new drawings and careful studies for adaptation to the position.

Dr. Graepp says, "Since these windows are small we would probably not want darker colors, even though they are in the east light."

The Design is kept consistently in harmony with the earlier windows, but in a somewhat lighter key, and with a bit more development of detail in recognition of its position.
