Apr.9,1945. C.J.C. also wrote Mr. Hatfield. "Another idea would be to use all a those windows, with the exception of the one in the vestibule, to symbolise that wonderful conception of St. Paul's in the 5th chapter of Gulatians, the 22nd verse, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance," - illustrating and symbolizing each one of those Spiritual Fruits by incidents from the Life of Christ. For example, Love might be represented by the visit of Christ to Many and Martha, or by the Raising of Lazarus.

The Rose window over the entrance is devoted to the eight Beatitudes - each one being symbolized by an angelic figure surrounded by cloud forms, stars of heavenly hope, and flames of religious zeal.

In the actual development of the full-size drawings, each angel

will bear symbols of the Beatitudes. For instance: -
