This plan can be effectively developed at a figure in accord with your suggestion for a typical nave window...An interesting scheme of iconography would feature the Sacraments, in the windows about the sanctuary, symbols recognizing the shrine dedications, a window devoted to St. Augustine, and a treatment of the transept groups to emphasize the distinction between the Old and New Dispensations.".
