the narrow fillet line and the wider color border. The tops would cut off just above the third unit.

The side transept windows devoted to Isaiah and St. Christopher are approximately the same width but only about sixty inches high. We would have a little glass left over from the south transept, but to build both of them up to the size of your windows would require quite a little additional work.

...We could get one more window from these two without a great amount of work."

Oct.17. Wrote Dr. Weld that we have just come across 2 more Peterboro wds in the studio...think they represent the original glass in the 2 side chancel windows which we replaced with figure compositions several years ago. With this glass we believe we can complete all five of the Holderness School windows. In every case, the best composition comes a little short of filling the entire height of the window openings. I think these few inches can best be made up with new glass that we can easily design and paint in a simple pattern to harmonize with the old glass.
