General Information Shield for a large plain glass window in a fraternity.

Harold Whitehouse sent a full size detail in color - there will be no mantling or crest.

"I think it would be best to lead off the red field in order to get a better quality of color than we can on a flashed glass. The bend can be a flashed ruby. ...In fact, break up the shield in any manner you see fit. May I suggest also that if you should care to make the shield slightly larger, you may do so, for instance, one inch wider and the length in proportion. However, this is not necessary, but if you care to do it, you may if it will help you in making up a better technique. I like the accidental leading very much, and a little painted texture would certainly add interest. I am going to leave it all to you.
