General Information Design submitted for typical one of group of four windows.
The pattern of light, varying tints is enriched with a border-line of full
color and a central symbol of St. Matthew - the winged man. As there are
four windows in the group, the four Evangelists can very appropriately
be symbolized here.

We have in mind using light Cathedral glasses without painted textures.
This glass will obscure any clear view of outside objects, but will also
admit an abundance of light.
