This window would be treated very much like the side chancel windows... my thought is that the shield of St. Patrick might very appropriately be represented in the upper medallion here.

Aug. 14, 1944.

Sept. 11. Father Reddington wrote: "...stress the fact that the colors in these windows should not be too dark. The chapel is located in a position somewhat shaded and if the glass is too dark it will necessitate constant use of artificial light whenever the chapel is used."

"The single narthex or vestibule window will be designed in the manner of the side chancel windows, with a symbol of St. Patrick in the upper part."
