Hiram Wendell Phillips, Master Diver.  
by his daughter Eva Phillips Boyd.

Phillips was born at Quincy Neck on Fore River in 1850.  
Plain Yankee ancestry that went back to the Mayflower.  
Lived most of his life on Town River at Quincy Point. The  
old homestead now demolished and even the contours of the land  
changed by ship building expansion.

Tanks of Standard Oil Company now occupy site.

He was of modest bearing, medium stature, but implied  
strength and commanded respect.

Open countenance, self reliance, exposure to wind and sun.  
Could work hard, shoulder responsibility, complete every project.  
Inventive.

Maintained a salvaging and diving business of his own. Had  
several narrow escapes under water. Difficult and exacting work  
strengthened his character.

Always intimate with nature; an intensely personal religion  
that did not necessarily mean churches; loved poetry.

Became involved in extensive legal controversy over work in  
New York harbor. Lost his savings, went back to work by the hour  
as diver and lost his life in accident under water just before case  
was settled in his favor after seven years' litigation. 73 years old.
