General Information C.J.C. wrote the Bishop. "I talked with Mr. Maginnis and Mr. McNally while we were in the church about the importance of keeping the windows light."

The small east window of the Baptistery bears a symbol of the descending Dove of the Holy Spirit, balanced by the Phoenix, symbol of Our Lord's sacrifice in the opposite Stair Window.
