Revised design sent Aug.17,1949 - - "a much younger figure. This suggests the general character; of course the detail will be worked out much more carefully in the full sized drawing."

Dr. and Mrs. Talbott still feel that the child in the window is a bit old. I saw a picture of the child who was 3 years old. She had light golden hair, but it was not curly, and more in a fluffy bob. A plump face, but not fat. The cheeks show a certain prominence, with a small chin.

Jan.24,1956. Dr. Talbott writes: "...I think Mrs. Talbott would be enthusiastic about it if we can get a sketch of a small enough child. Every child we have had seems to have been too mature." (Try again, keeping the child younger and not quite so material, - a little more ethereal.).
