

Description of design. "The large medallion of the lower dominant panel is devoted to the representation of Christ Blessing Little Children, with the text from St. Luke 18:16 on the open book below, "Suffer little children to come unto me... for of such is the kingdom of God." Braise and Prayer Growing vine forms, flowering in the lily of purity, enrich the field and outline the medallions -

continuing through the upper panels where the medallions are accented with childish figures and members of the angelic host at the top, - angels

of Braise and Prayer with trumpet and censer and a kneeding musical angel in the tracery circle. Interposed with these are roses, symbolic of divine love. Accenting the wide border of conventional cloud forms of pure rich blue are stars of heavenly devotion and steadfastness. The entire composition is designed in pure rich color, but with sufficient passages of brilliant gold and silver to admit an abundance of illumination.

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
