General Information Archangel Michael, Militant Leader; and Archangel Gabriel,  
Messenger of Peace. "Christ in the Home of Martha and Mary",

As to color: both Miss Townsend and Mrs. Lucas feel that these windows  
should be in keeping with those in the body of the church, not too light.  
Use Camelia as flower in both background patterns.  
They would like special symbols - Mrs. McEachin (Michael) was passionately  
fond of flowers, her favorites being the chrysanthemum\* and the camelia, use  
for Mary; Butterbeans for Martha.  
Dr. Lucas' mother, Mrs. Caroline Ravenel Lucas, was especially fond of the  
Easter Lily.
