The comes are wide, at least 1/2 inch and the glass is ~~1/4 inch thick~~, clear plate double strength window glass. The transom pieces have a double came all around the edge. This double came does not show on the sketch but we indicate it in free hand at the bottom of letter (from Mr. Dick, Feb. 19, 1947.).

There will be a deep groove behind the cusps of the transom lights to facilitate installation, and Dick will install them.

Two Sacristy windows devoted to youths of the Old Testament, Samuel and David. Samuel holds the censer of worship and prayer, and the rays of light above him suggest the presence of the Lord. The open book is inscribed with the text: "Then Samuel answered, Speak; for thy servant heareth." (I Samuel 3:10).

The young David, sweet singer of Israel, holds his harp, and the text below is from his sixth verse, twenty-seventh Psalm: "I will sing, yea, I will sing praises unto the Lord."

The grapevine motif forms a border pattern carrying into the tracery, accented with the six-pointed stars of the Old Testament."
