General Information These are inside doors and the vestibule is on a higher level than the outside door that supplies what light it receives, so that you look into a grey stone wall through these panels. These should be designed in rather simple background leading, with symbols and medallions in very light tints. Possibly with a narrow color border and two small simple medallions of kneeling angels of Praise and Prayer.

Description of design: "The design for the openings in the double doors of the vestibule appears in the sketch to be somewhat of the same light value as the corridor window, but actually it would have much less texture, in fact, I think the field can be entirely clear with very little more than a line pattern to define the figures. The medallions suggest kneeling angels of prayer and praise, with censer and trumpet. All would be in quite light glass of irregular surface to catch and reflect all the available illumination."

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
