General Information *These are now double-hung and they need some ventilation in this group. The proposal is to make new single sash and possibly hinge a couple of them at the top so they can swing in. They do not have them open during the service - only before and after. We might also have in mind hinging these frames to metal casements when such frames are available. They would take care of the carpentry work there.

Dr. Baillie's first thought for this group of windows is based around the Last Supper, but he realizes we could hardly have the usual Last Supper idea. Another thought is centered around St. Luke, as the principal donor wishes to memorialize a physician. St. Luke might be accompanied by related characters such as Barnabas and Timothy, completing the group in that way.
