General Information Furnish and install Cathedral Glass, leaded in diamond ^{or}
pattern, in sections of the two larger lancets on the sides of the Chapel
and the two windows, one at either side of the south entrance, not
including ventilators.

(Note: the two behind organ are approximately 28 inches wide by 40 inches high
according to the small scale drawing. This gives them 9' each instead of
37' each.) *This would make the price per foot 31.75 - but the
difference may be applied to the increased
footage of the rose.*
